


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INTRODUCTION TO EMADRASAH



الحمد لله رب العالمين والصلاة والسلام على أشرف الأنبياء والمرسلين

Allah (SWT) has guided humanity through prophets, from Adam (AS) to the final messenger, Muhammad (SAW). After the departure of the Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him), the torch of knowledge and guidance was entrusted to the Ulema and Muhadditheen (scholars and hadith narrators), who diligently preserved and transmitted the divine message, Islam through the ages leading us towards success in this life and the hereafter. As it is the only path to true fulfillment. Allah says in the Holy Quran:

If anyone seeks a religion other than Islam, it will not be accepted from him; he will be among the losers in the Hereafter. (Quran; 3:85)

The preservation of Islamic teachings necessitates that the methods of religious education evolve with time, just as they have throughout history.

For instance, the Prophet (SAW) established Dar-al-Arqam in Makkah Al-Mukarramah a place for education, training, dawah, and guidance. He also set up Suffah, a sheltered raised platform adjacent to Masjid an-Nabawi, in Madinah for the same purpose. After that different Mosques, Madaris, and Makatib, continued that legacy to share the same objectives and manifesto to illuminate the path of guidance, uphold the correct faith, and preserve the Islamic identity.

In this digital age, where technology is reshaping our approach to knowledge acquisition, it is compulsory to transform the delivery of Islamic education to maintain the legacy of the prophets and scholars. This is where eMadrasah comes into play an e-learning platform that embodies the spirit of Prophet Muhammad's (SAW) Suffah for the modern era. It aims to spread the teaching of that Suffah worldwide and connect people to its roots to guide them to the correct faith and Sunnah, ensuring the methodology of pious predecessors (Salaf).

WHAT IS EMADRASAH

eMadrasah is the upgraded version of the Islamic schools (like traditional Madaris, Makatib & Jamiyaat), carrying the torch of guidance from the prophetic generation to another. "E" in 'eMadrasah' signifies our strong bond with the electronic and internet world, drawing parallels with concepts like e-mail and e-book. A Madrasah is referred to as an Islamic institute, especially in the Indian subcontinent, or a place of learning in the Arabic language. Our name represents our goal of spreading the timeless teachings of Islam, even as time changes itself.






